

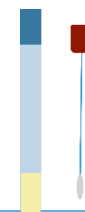
Clinical Checklist for Specimen Collection of COVID-19 Test

The following checklist was developed to assist appropriate nursing home clinical staff in collecting specimens for a COVID-19 test. All nursing home testing will be utilizing anterior nares testing, a non-invasive form of COVID-19 testing available. Testing staff and residents in Ohio's nursing facilities is one of many strategies being deployed in congregate care settings to help prevent the spread of COVID-19 and save lives.

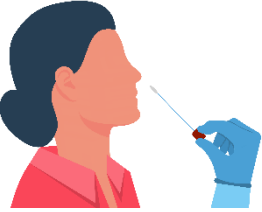
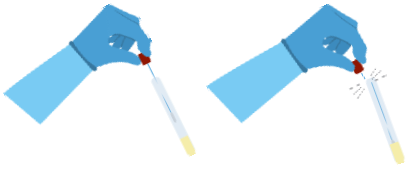

STEP	PROCESS CHECK LIST
Prepare your patients(s)	☐ Briefly describe the test, the materials, process and timing for results ○ Inform the patient that the anterior nares test is not painful and can be accomplished in under 30 seconds. ☐ Have the patient blow their nose, if possible ○ Remind the patient that he/she can stop the collection at any time ☐ Answer the patient's questions, hear concerns, and consider any special conditions or considerations
Preparing the collection station	☐ Confirm list of patients to be tested ☐ Verify lab requisition form has been completed electronically ☐ Preprint labels for each patient to be applied to the specimen vial, or gather supplies to write each patient's name, patient ID, and date of birth on the specimen vial ☐ Gather PPE ○ Face mask, ideally a N95 mask if available ○ Eye protection ○ Gown ○ Gloves ☐ Recruit a second person to assist with specimen collection ○ Person A, donning PPE, will swab the patient ▪ This person must be appropriately trained clinical staff, preferably an LPN or RN. ○ Person B, donning PPE, holds specimen bag and assist with administrative tasks ▪ Having a second person will minimize contamination by limiting potentially contaminated contact with the outside of the specimen bag and paperwork ○ If a second person is not available, tape the specimen bag with the opening easily accessible to the side of the table to prevent unnecessary contact ☐ Check testing kit/specimen packet

Specimen Flocked
Vial Nasal
Swab

	○ Read manufacturer specific instructions ○ Flocked nasal swab - <i>used to collect specimen</i> ○ Specimen vial with liquid transport medium
Preparing yourself	☐ Wash hands ☐ Put on appropriate personal protective equipment ○ Person A ○ Face mask, ideally a N95 mask if available ○ Gloves ○ Eye protection ○ Gown ○ Person B ○ Face mask, ideally a N95 mask if available ○ Gloves ○ Eye protection – <i>if working within 6ft of patient being swabbed</i> ○ Gown – <i>if working within 6ft of patient being swabbed</i>
Conducting the Specimen Collection	☐ Remove swab from testing kit packet ☐ With the patient sitting comfortably, slightly tilt their head back ☐ Insert the swab, keeping it nearly parallel to the floor, into the patient's nostril - inserting no more than 1 inch into the nostril. ☐ When the swab is in place, rotate in a circular motion for 5 seconds at a 45° angle ☐ Using the same swab, remove from the first nostril to the second nostril and repeat the process 
After Collection	☐ Remove cap from vial and insert swab into the vial ☐ Break the stick of the swab off, and discard in appropriate biohazard waste receptacle to prevent potential contamination ○ The flocked portion of the swab should remain in the liquid medium ☐ Ensure that the cap is tightly screwed back on the vial ☐ Apply identifying information from preprinted labels or, if necessary, hand-written stickers to the vial ☐ Place vial into the specimen bag with the lab requisition form, sealing the top of the bag adequately ☐ Explain how results will be shared with the patient and answer any outstanding questions ☐ Safely discard used PPE ○ Staff should always change gloves between patients ☐ Clean and disinfect space where collection/swabbing occurred ☐ Prepare for to swab the next patients 
Specimen storage and pick-up	☐ Pack and prepare specimens for pick-up by the courier at the facilities identified time period. ☐ For more information on specimen pick-up and transport, please reference the Specimen Storage and Transport Check List available on Ohio's Testing in Nursing Homes Website.
