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PHE Challenges for ICFs/IID:

- Active treatment
 - Access to Personal Protective Equipment (PPE)
 - Visitation
 - Financial impact
 - Staffing hiring and retention
 - COVID Education and vaccinations for clients and staff
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Workforce shortages:

- ICF stakeholders have expressed significant concerns about staffing shortages prior to the PHE and especially during the PHE.
- 1135 waivers
- Federal and State COVID Relief funds
- Creative approaches to filling and retaining staff.

COVID-19 vaccine staff immunization requirements:

- Standard: COVID-19 Vaccination of facility staff. The facility must develop and implement policies and procedures to ensure that all staff are fully vaccinated for COVID-19.
 - 1) Regardless of clinical responsibility or client contact, the policies and procedures must apply to the following facility staff, who provide any care, treatment, or other services for the facility and/or its clients:

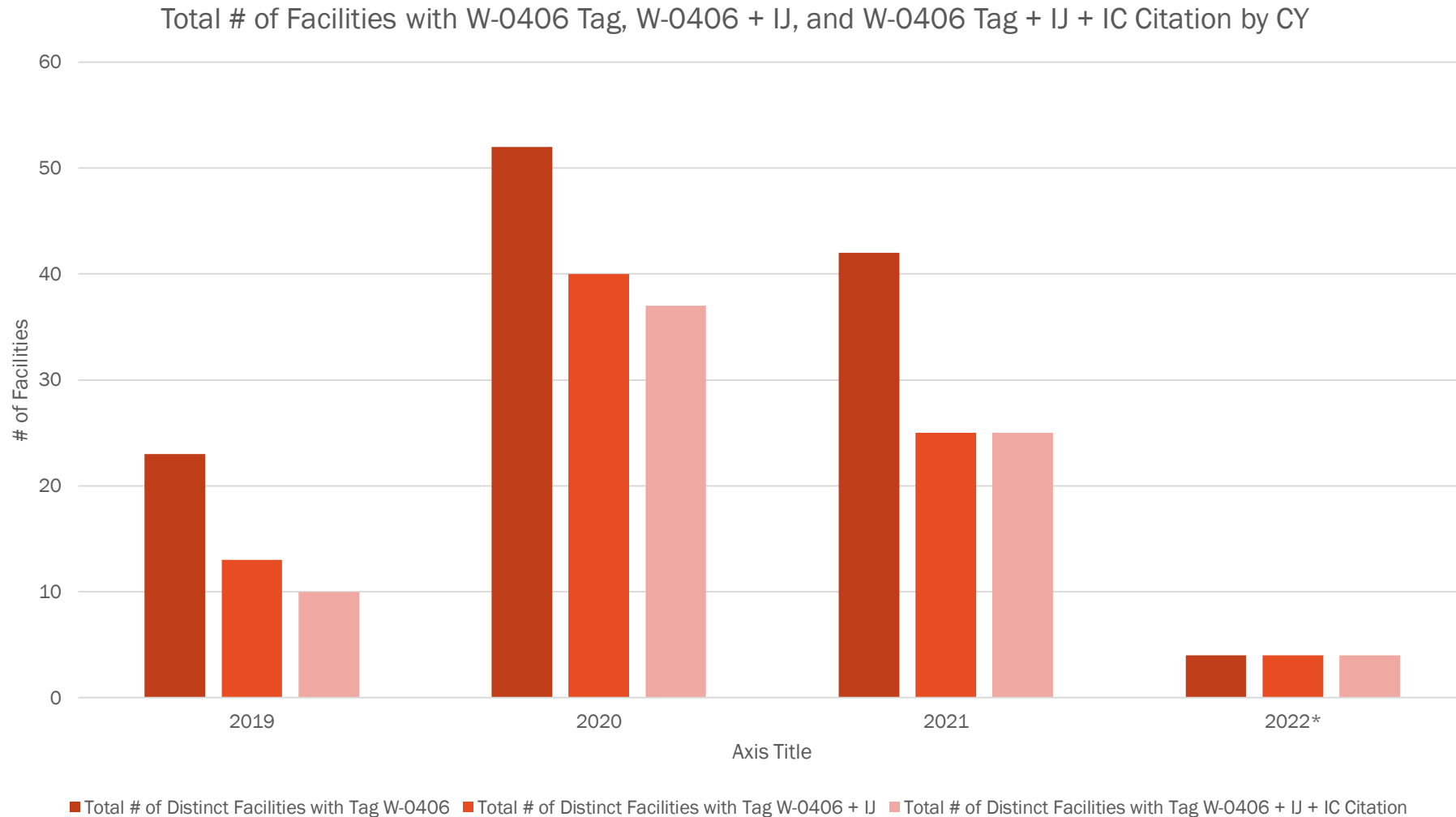

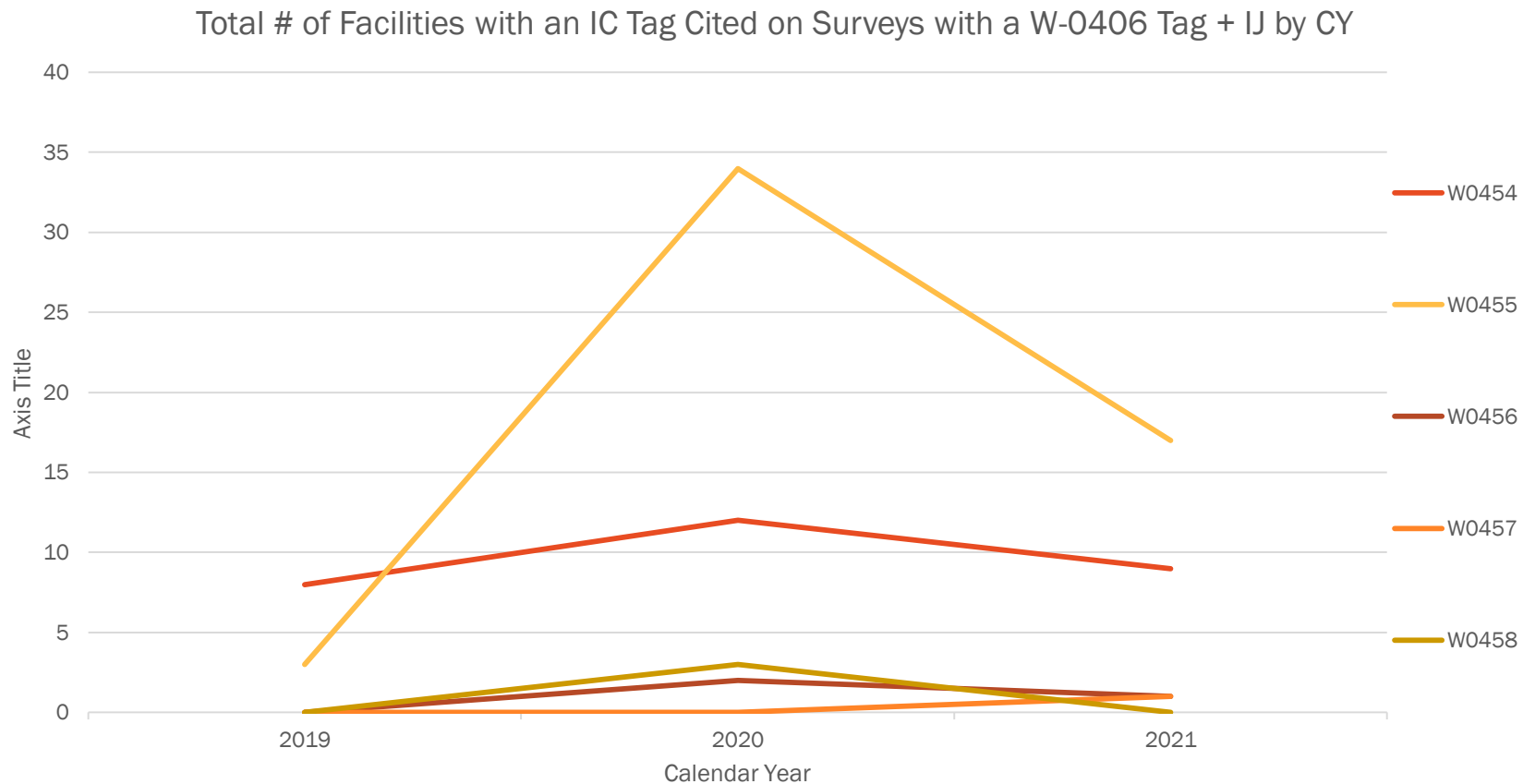

Focused Fundamental Survey Process:

- Changes:
 - Focused fundamental survey replaced the fundamental survey.
 - Uses a concept of key standards and corresponding standards within the Conditions of Participation (CoPs). (Refer to Appendix J)
 - Primary method of information gathering is observation allowing more effective use of interviews and client record reviews.
 - The core sample is selected based on minimum criteria without regard to client developmental levels.
 - The review of the facility's systems to prevent abuse, neglect or mistreatment and resolve complaints (Task 2) is a phased approach that focuses the surveyor on client observations including staff-to-client and client-to-client interactions and follow up interviews.
- Process applies to all ICF/IID recertification surveys (as appropriate)
