Reasons for Not Returning to ADS/VH (in order of significance)

Lack of qualified/available providers

 Includes comments re waitlists, preferences for specific services (ie earning money), lack of staff

COVID-related concerns (self or household)

Lack of transportation

Change in personal preference

Includes retirement (many comments on this)

Behavioral needs

 Includes comments that individuals who require significant support are not a priority for day programs

Medical needs

Community employment

Other trends from comments:

- Individuals who cannot/will not comply with masking and social distancing
- Need for meaningful work opportunities with staff support
- Basic service needs are being met but limited socialization for individuals who have not returned
- Some clients tried to return but did not feel comfortable because others were not wearing masks
- HPC providers are strained due to staffing with so many individuals at home
