

Onboarding OhioISP – Preparation Checklist

Complete this checklist/plan to prepare for onboarding and implementation of OhioISP.

- Complete the OhioISP Onboarding survey by 10/29/21: Onboarding OhioISP ICFs
- All plan authors must complete OhioISP Training Parts 1-3.
 Training may be completed by either one or a combination of the following ways:
 - myLearning will receive CPDs individually
 - OhioISP website document completion using <u>OhioISP Group Training attendance</u> <u>verification form</u> and maintain for your records.
- □ Consider the following approaches to implementation:
 - o Download and begin using and becoming familiar with the OhiolSP Paper Version
 - If using a third-party vendor for OhioISP, coordinate with your vendor to determine when you may start using their online system, OR
 - o Utilize DODD's free online system for OhioISP
- □ Complete facility self-assessment to develop action plan and steps

Facility Self-Assessment

Consider the following tasks as you develop a timeline and plan for implementation and onboarding. This is meant to provide your facility with a place to start and is certainly not all-inclusive list of activities. This self-assessment is meant for your facility's use only. DODD will not be requesting this information.

- Evaluate current team process, does it include:
 - Necessary people?
 - Appropriate places?
 - Quality conversations?
 - Accurate priorities?
- Evaluate current processes, procedures, and associated documents to determine what is/is not required or adding value as it relates to:
 - Ongoing Team Process
 - Assessment
 - Planning
 - Monitoring
 - Revision
- □ Evaluate current (or develop/implement) processes that support learning, quality, and the new approach to assessment, planning, monitoring, and revision. Consider:
 - Peer, team, and/or supervisor reviews
 - Scheduled quality assurance reviews
- □ Identify current strengths and challenges, both individually and as groups, across your agency.
 - Consider training, learning, mentoring, and connect to internal and external resources.
 - Discover and challenge thinking and culture that will prevent successful adoption of OhioISP.
