MEMORY CARE-WHAT DOES THIS RULE MEAN?

- <u>Rule 173-39-02.16 Ohio Administrative Code</u> Ohio Laws
- OAC 173-39-02.16(D)(2)(b) Provider designates the single-occupancy resident unit in paragraph (C)(2(c) of this rule to be a stand-alone memory care unit, a memory care unit in a memory care section of the RCF, or a memory care unit in an RCF of a provider that provides only memory care.
- **Demonstrating compliance**: The provider decides where to deliver memory care within the setting.
 - Example: Provider delivers memory care only within a secured wing of the setting.
 - Example: Provider delivers memory care within the secured wing of the setting and within a section of the setting which isn't secured.



MEMORY CARE-WHAT DOES THIS RULE MEAN?

- <u>Rule 173-39-02.16 Ohio Administrative Code</u> Ohio Laws
- OAC 173-39-02.16(D)(2)(d) The provider ensures safe access to outdoor space for individuals.
- **Demonstrating compliance**: For memory care delivered on secured wings, residents have access to outdoor space.
 - Example: Staff unlock doors to outside upon resident request (identified in the person-centered services plan).
 - Example: Activities take place outside during warmer months.
 - Example: Staff unlock door everyday from 2:00 p.m. 3:00 p.m. (weather permitted) since most residents prefer to go outside in the afternoon.



MEMORY CARE-WHAT DOES THIS RULE MEAN?

- <u>Rule 173-39-02.16 Ohio Administrative Code</u> Ohio Laws
- OAC 173-39-02.16(D)(3)(b)(i) If providing both memory care and the basic service, a ratio that is at least 20% higher than the provider's ratio for its basic service.
- **Demonstrating compliance**: Utilize staffing ratio tool(s).


