MEMORANDUM

Re: Intermediate Remedies for Nursing Homes and Residential Care Facilities

Date: October 2, 2023

Ohio House Bill 33 (135th General Assembly) provisions become effective on Tuesday, October 3, 2023. HB 33 included revisions to Section 3721.99 of the Ohio Revised Code (R.C.) addressing intermediate remedies for nursing homes and residential care facilities. The new provisions give the Director of the Ohio Department of Health (ODH) greater flexibility in fostering compliance with state regulations (see R.C. Section 3721.99 in <u>House Bill 33</u> to review the changes).

Under R.C. section 3721.99, the ODH Director may impose any of the following remedies on homes as defined by R.C. section 3721.01, which includes nursing homes and residential care facilities, found to be non-compliant with state regulations:

- Request the home's licensee to submit a corrective action plan.
- Impose a civil monetary penalty.
- Revoke a home's license.

If the ODH Director elects to impose an intermediate civil monetary penalty, factors that will be considered in determining the amount include, but are not limited to, the severity of non-compliance and the home's history of compliance.
