EXPLANATION OF REQUEST Notice to Offerors

The Richland County Board of Developmental Disabilities (hereinafter RCBDD) currently owns the license for an 8 bed Intermediate Care Facility known as the Cherry Hill Home. This home is located at 786 Ferndale Rd. Mansfield, OH. 44907 and is owned by the Pediatric Development Center, Inc. (housing board). Due to the increased needs to keep youth involved with multiple agencies in Richland County, the Richland County Board of Developmental Disabilities is interested in partnering with a respective provider that specializes in serving youth with multiple/complex needs. This partnership would entail RCBDD maintaining the licensed beds while the provider would manage the educational, employment and support services and other day to day operation to children and young adults with developmental disabilities and other complex needs. Further, it would require the provider to collaborate and engage with the Ohio Rise Program for any individuals that meet the program criteria.

The goal of RCBDD is to provide necessary services to youth who are in jeopardy of being placed out of county due to their unique needs and circumstances. With a current maximum capacity of 5 youth ages 14 - 21 years of age, our goal is to have a provider that specializes in services designed to keep these youth in their county while working with all necessary entities (family, schools, county agencies) to help the youth learn the appropriate skills of community living. The remaining four licensed beds may be reserved for respite needs of other individuals deemed appropriate or expansion of services if the support needs of all individuals allows for such expansion.

The female youth currently residing in the Multi System Youth Program shall be eligible for residential services from Intermediate Care Facility for Individuals with Intellectual Disabilities (ICFIID) and the chosen provider must be certified by the Ohio Department of Health to provide ICFIID services. Furthermore, the nature and extent of the disabilities of the selected youth will require additional supplemental services as the current per diem reimbursement rates will not meet the youth's complex needs. All youth for this program will be selected by both the RCBDD and provider with the ultimate decision being made by the RCBDD.

The financial plan attached to this Management Proposal Request shall take into account how many staff will be expected along with all room and board costs, vehicle leasing, rent and utilities and any other ancillary services the provider feels will be necessary to provide and maintain excellent services to these youth. Being that these are specialized services with unique clientele, only those companies that have a proven track record and can meet the needs listed above shall apply.

For purposes of this Management Proposal Request, RCBDD will receive proposals at the office of the Richland County Board of Developmental Disabilities, Administration Building, 314 Cleveland Ave., Mansfield, Ohio 44902, until 10:30 am, Ohio Standard Time, on Friday, July 15, 2022. Withdrawal of Proposal

Offerors may withdraw their proposals at any time prior to the award of the contract.

Award of Contract

The Owner may award a contract to the offeror whose proposal is determined to be the most advantageous to the county, taking into consideration the evaluation factors and criteria developed by the Owner.

Rejection of Proposals

- a. The Owner reserves the right to reject any proposal in which the offeror takes exception to the terms and conditions of the proposal; fails to meet the terms and conditions of the proposal, including but not limited to, the standards, specifications, and requirements specified in the proposal; or submits prices that the Owner considers to be excessive, compared to existing market conditions, or determines exceed the available funds of the Owner.
- b. The Owner reserves the right to reject, in whole or in part, any proposal that the Owner has determined, using the factors and criteria the Owner develops.
- c. The Owner may conduct discussions with offerors who submit proposals for the purpose of clarifications or corrections regarding a proposal to ensure full understanding of, and responsiveness to, the requirements specified in the proposal.

Vendor Acceptance

The Offeror shall submit a signed Vendor Acceptance form and submit with your proposal. The Vendor Acceptance form must be signed by a legally authorized representative.

Termination of Negotiation

The Owner may terminate negotiations with an offeror at any time during the negotiation process if the offeror fails to provide the necessary information for negotiations in a timely manner, or fails to

negotiate in good faith. If the Owner terminates negotiations with an offeror, the Owner shall negotiate with the offeror whose proposal is ranked the next most advantageous to the county, according to the factors and criteria developed by the Owner.
