The Ohio Department of Medicaid is announcing the Civil Money Penalty Reinvestment Program (CMP-RP) Nursing Facility Grant Cycle for State Fiscal Year 2025

- A total of \$3.5 million is available.
- The application cycle is open for 60 days.
- Funding Priority: Projects that support the State of Ohio quality initiatives:
 - Improve Quality of Life
 - Improve Quality of Care
 - Promote Resident Rights
 - Improve System Performance
 - Improve Physical Activity
 - Improve Social Connectedness
 - Reduce Depression & Cognitive Decline
 - Reduce Falls and Chronic pain
