Re: State-supported COVID-19 testing program update

Dear Administrators of Assisted Living Facilities and Nursing Homes,

Keeping Ohioans safer through COVID-19 testing has been core to Ohio's pandemic response strategy. Prioritizing at-risk Ohioans within long-term care facilities by making tests accessible and at no cost has been foundational to the success of the COVID-19 state-supported testing program.

With the end of the federal public health emergency, as well as considering declining rates of infection, the State of Ohio is making changes to the COVID-19 state-supported testing program.

The following will go into effect on July 1, 2023:

- Any facility that opted into the state-supported program <u>with</u> an active CLIA Certificate of
 Waiver on file in the <u>COVID-19 Care Center Portal</u> will be eligible to receive state-supported
 rapid antigen tests.
- Any facility that opted into the state-supported program <u>without</u> an active CLIA Certificate of
 Waiver on file in the <u>COVID-19 Care Center Portal</u> will <u>not</u> be eligible to receive rapid antigen
 tests.
- PCR tests will no longer be available through the state-supported program.

Please log in to the <u>COVID-19 Care Center Portal</u> soon to update your profile, verify your CLIA Certificate of Waiver status, and select your testing option. Facilities will automatically default into a plan based upon their CLIA Certificate of Waiver status on July 1, 2023. No action is needed if you are opted out of the program. A <u>user guide</u> to assist is available.

You are encouraged to keep apprised of <u>CDC recommendations</u>, <u>state reporting requirements</u>, and the <u>Electronic Laboratory Reporting process</u>. The <u>Regional Rapid Response Assistance Program (R³AP)</u> can answer questions on testing, vaccine, and infection prevention and control at 1-855-R3AP-ODA.
