Immunity 100 R.C. 3792.05 101 Revises the bill's provisions governing immunity from 102 liability as follows: 103 (1) Grants a congregate care setting immunity from 104 administrative and civil liability if an advocate contracts, as 105 a result of serving as the advocate, an infectious disease other 106 than a foodborne disease, rather than granting such immunity 107 only to care settings that are hospitals and health care 108 facilities and only when the advocate contracts the infectious 109 disease during the advocate's quarantine with the patient as 110 under the bill's current version; 111 (2) Specifies that the foregoing immunity does not extend 112 to a claim of negligence or medical malpractice against a 113 hospital or health care facility for any care provided to the 114 advocate should the advocate seek treatment at the hospital or 115 facility for the infectious disease, rather than for any care 116
